## Certified Organic Includes EcoCert & Made With Organic Grapes







- Vineyard/Farm: 3rd Party Certified Organic. No synthetic pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, or fertilizers
- Winery: Facility is certified by 3rd party to meet organic standards
- 100% Organic Grapes
- Yeast: Native, Organic, or Conventional
- Sulfites: Up to 100ppm



### Organic Vineyard

Same as above, except:

- Winery: Conventional processing aids are unregulated & may contain chemical additives
- Sulfites: Up to 350ppm



# USDA Certified Organic/No Sulfites Added



- Vineyard/Farm: 3rd Party Certified Organic. No synthetic pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, or fertilizers
- Winery: Facility is certified by 3rd party to meet organic standards
- 100% Organic Grapes
- Yeast: Native or USDA Organic
- Sulfites: None added. Naturally occurring up to 10ppm



### Certified Biodynamic



- Vineyard/Farm: 3rd Party Certified Biodynamic. No synthetic pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, or fertilizers
- Winery: Facility is certified by 3rd party to meet Biodynamic standards
- 100% Biodynamic Grapes
- Yeast: Native; no acid or sugar adjustments
- Sulfites: Up to 100ppm
- Biodynamics treat the vineyard as a self-sustaining, living organism & vine care & harvesting schedules are based on the astronomical calendar



## Biodynamic Vineyard

Same as above, except:

- Winery: Conventional processing aids are unregulated & may contain chemical additives
- Sulfites: Up to 350ppm



#### Vegan

- No animal products are used during fining (Many common fining agents are derived from animal byproducts)
- There is no official designation for vegan wines



#### Certified Sustainable







- Different certifiers such as SIP, Lodi Rules, LIVE & CCSW have their own standards & rules
- Vineyard/Winery: Focused on practices addressing habitat, water, energy, soil, recycling, air quality, packaging, pest management, 8 social equity
- Yeast: Native or Conventional
- Sulfites: Up to 350ppm







# Organic Practicing, Biodynamic Practicing, & Sustainable Practicing

 These abbreviations signify wineries that demonstrate a strong dedication to organic, Biodynamic, or sustainable practices, though they are not certified

#### La Lutte Raisonnée

- Literally translated to "reasoned struggle" in French, this is a pragmatic approach to farming where chemical treatments are used only when absolutely necessary
- A first step towards full organic farming for some growers, a happy medium for others
